To Gosport Borough Council,

My wife and I recently tried to submit our views on the Waterfront proposals but your online form failed before we were able to complete the exercise. My wife has now received an acknowledgement from you in respect to her e-mail submission and I have now decided to follow her lead.

I apologise that the following comments are far less detailed than those I tried to submit online but I cannot bring myself to spend that amount of time again.

The Gosport waterfront is currently open and welcoming from the water and does not need any more intensive development, particularly high rise. The existing residential tower blocks already provide sufficient height and mass. The bus station is probably long overdue for sympathetic redevelopment with a transport interchange at ground level (with buses and taxis linking with the ferry) and shops, restaurants and cafes at ground and upper levels. This development should leave the Falkland Gardens, a feature which differentiates Gosport from other towns, untouched and should not include residential.

Any development should not compromise existing car parking provision and indeed should add to this, particularly if it is
intended to attract visitors to the town. Any new build should also link with the High Street so that visitors arriving by
boat - ferry or private yacht - are drawn into the High Street and some 'cosmetic surgery' to the facades of the shops
closest the ferry should also be considered.
