1. Introduction and Background

INTRODUCTION

- **1.1** The National Planning Policy Framework (NPFF) requires each local planning authority to produce a Local Plan for its area. Local Plans should address the spatial implications of economic, social and environmental change. Local Plans should be based on an adequate, up to date and relevant evidence base.
- 1.2 Strategic Leisure Limited (SLL) was commissioned by Gosport Borough Council (GBC) in April 2013 to carry out a review and to update the Indoor Sports and Playing Pitch Assessment 2008.
- 1.3 This Indoor Sports assessment provides an update to the 2008 Indoor Sports Assessment and an analysis of the current level of sports hall, swimming pool, health and fitness and squash court provision in the Borough.
- 1.4 The Playing Pitch assessment provides an update to the 2008 Playing Pitch Assessment and an analysis of the current level of pitch provision within the local authority area.
- 1.5 The key objectives of this study are:
 - To analyse and assess the current level and quality of indoor sports and pitch provision in Gosport;
 - Identify levels of demand for pitches and identify any surplus or deficit in Gosport;
 - Provide strategic options and recommendations for future pitch and indoor sport provision in Gosport.
- 1.6 The key drivers for this assessment are:
 - To inform decision making processes relating to the provision of playing pitches and indoor sports facilities both now, and as the population grows and the profile of the population changes in Gosport to 2021.
 - Gosport Borough Council is in a challenging financial environment and needs to work in partnership with all Playing Pitch and Indoor Sports Stakeholders to be able to deliver the requirements for playing pitches to the community in the future.

NATIONAL POLICY CONTEXT

1.7 In March 2012, the Government published the *'National Planning Policy Statement'* (2012), setting out its economic, environmental and social planning policies for England. Taken together, these policies articulate the Government's vision of sustainable development, which should be interpreted and applied locally to meet local aspirations.

1.8 In relation to planning for sports provision NPPF (paragraph 73 & 74) states:

"Access to high quality open spaces and opportunities for sport and recreation can make an important contribution to the health and well-being of communities. Planning policies should be based on robust and up-todate assessments of the needs for open space, sports and recreation facilities and opportunities for new provision. The assessments should identify specific needs and quantitative or qualitative deficits or surpluses of open space, sports and recreational facilities in the local area. Information gained from the assessments should be used to determine what open space, sports and recreational provision is required."

- 1.9 Existing open space, sports and recreational buildings and land, including playing fields, should not be built on unless:
 - An assessment has been undertaken which has clearly shown the open space, buildings or land to be surplus to requirements; or
 - The loss resulting from the proposed development would be replaced by equivalent or better provision in terms of quantity and quality in a suitable location; or
 - The development is for alternative sports and recreational provision, the needs for which clearly outweigh the loss.
- 1.10 **Sport England Playing pitch policy:** Sport England's national policies in relation to playing pitches are contained in '*A Sporting Future for the Playing Fields of England*' (2002). It contains a policy of resisting the loss of pitches unless one or more of the following five conditions are met:
 - a. A carefully quantified and documented assessment of current and future needs has demonstrated to the satisfaction of Sport England that there is an excess of facility provision in the catchment and that the site has no special significance to the interests of sport.
 - **b.** The proposed development is ancillary to the principal use of the site as a playing field or outdoor sports facility and does not affect the quantity or quality of facilities or adversely affect their use.
 - c. The proposed development affects only land incapable of forming a playing pitch or outdoor sports facility and does not result in:
 - The loss or loss of use of, any facility (including the maintenance of adequate safety margins).
 - A reduction in the size of the playing area of any facility.
 - The loss of any other sports/ancillary facilities on site.
 - d. The playing field or outdoor sports facility which would be lost as a result of the proposed development would be replaced by facilities of an equivalent or better quality, in a suitable location and subject to equivalent or better management arrangements, prior to the commencement of the development.

e. The proposed development is for an indoor or outdoor sports facility, the provision of which would be of sufficient benefit to the development of sport to outweigh the detriment caused by the loss of playing field or current outdoor facility.

LOCAL CONTEXT

1.11 Gosport Borough is located in South Hampshire on the western side of Portsmouth Harbour opposite the city of Portsmouth. The Borough is a peninsula of 2,750 hectares surrounded on three sides by The Solent and Portsmouth Harbour with almost 39 kilometers of coastline. It is predominately urban in character and contains two principal settlements, Gosport and Lee-on-the-Solent, separated by the Alver Valley.

DEMOGRAPHICS

- 1.12 The population of the Borough is 83,740 persons in 2013 (ONS Population interim (Sept 2012).Gosport is also one of the most densely populated areas in the South East Region.
- 1.13 According to the latest long term population projections¹ the Borough's population will increase by about 2.2% over the Local Plan period to 2029 with the number of households projected to increase by 8.5%. The average household size is 2.38 persons and is projected to decrease to 2.24 persons by 2029.
- 1.14 The Borough's population is ageing due largely to a longer life expectancy and a low birth rate; this is in line with the national trend. The proportion of over 65's will increase from 17.2% in 2011 to 24.% in 2029 with the number of residents over 65 increasing by 42.4% over the same period which represents approximately 6,000 people. As part of this trend there is a marked increase in those living beyond 85 with an 82% increase over the Local Plan period (2011-2029).
- 1.15 At the same time the number aged under-16 is falling in both proportion and absolute terms. In 2011 18.7% of the population was under 16; by 2029 this is projected to fall to 17.9%. It is projected that there will be a 2.2% fall in the number of people aged under 16. It is however important to acknowledge that some areas of the Borough such as Grange ward have experienced a population increase amongst the younger age groups and has one of the most youthful age profiles in England.
- 1.16 In relation to the traditional working age population (16-64), it is projected that these age groups will decrease by 7.4% in absolute terms over the Plan period with the proportion falling from 64% in 2011 to 58% in 2029.

SUMMARY

1.17 As Gosport's population grows there will be a need to ensure that sports and recreation facilities are developed to meet the needs of the growing population. Facilities providing activities for older people as well as facilities for the younger generation that promote sport and physical activity will assist in the decrease of health deprivation within the Borough, which includes two areas within the top 15% most deprived in terms of health indices (Indices of Multiple Deprivation 2010).

GOSPORT'S SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY STRATEGY

- 1.18 Gosport's Sustainable Community Strategy sets out Gosport's 2026 Vision. This Vision provides a common goal for public organisations, businesses, schools, and everyone who works and lives in the Borough to aim towards.
- 1.19 The vision states:

"There will be plenty of high quality and affordable leisure and recreational opportunities in the Borough. The proportion of adults taking part in organised competitive sport (especially athletic, running and aquatic activities) will remain high. Open space for recreational and amenity purposes will be retained and sport pitches and play areas improved. The coastline and waterfront will be accessible and enjoyed by many. Leisure facilities will be of a high standard and will provide activities for all age groups."

LOCAL PLAN 2011 – 2029 (DRAFT)

- 1.20 The Local Plan proposes that growth within Gosport is located within existing urban areas, and is not reliant on major new Greenfield sites that are dependent on the provision of completely new infrastructure. Growth within Gosport is therefore more dependent on the general provision of infrastructure keeping pace with development. This, however, makes determining the required infrastructure a more complex undertaking requiring an understanding of the levels, and any deficits, of existing provision.
- 1.21 The role of the Local Plan is therefore to help maintain existing infrastructure and where possible improve upon it.
- 1.22 The emerging Local Plan covers the period up to 2029 i.e. another 8 years beyond the scope of this Assessment. With projected population rises this further highlights the imperative to safeguard existing sites and improve their quality to ensure that they can be more intensively used.

SPORT ENGLAND STRATEGY 2012 – 2017

1.23 The 'Sport England Strategy 2012 - 2017' (2012) places emphasis on developing facilities and activity programmes on school sites, which highlights the need to formalise existing community access to education sports facilities and pitches and to develop additional opportunities, using available Sport England funding where appropriate. This is particularly relevant to Gosport where there is a strong reliance on school sites.

SPORT ENGLAND - ACTIVE PEOPLE

- 1.24 Sport England's Active People Data provides participation data across England, Counties and Local Authorities.
- 1.25 The following table 1.1 identifies the data for Gosport utilising participation data across six Sport England Surveys.

- 1.26 The participation in moderate intensity sport once a week varies across the different surveys in Gosport with a peak in 2008/09 of 38.4% participation and a low of 33% in 2005/06. The 2010/11 participation rate 35.9% is just below the England participation rate (36%), South East (37.4%) and Hampshire (37.6%).
- 1.27 Active People has identified the top 5 sports participated in Gosport. These are shown in Table 1.2 below.

- 1.28 The top sports are cycling and football and these sports are also higher participation rates than the South East and England. Swimming is the next most participated in sport but has lower participation than the South East and England this may be due to there only being two accessible swimming pools in Gosport. This may indicate that there is a high level of latent demand.
- 1.29 The new swimming pool facilities at the Gosport Leisure Centre may help meet any latent demand.

SPORT ENGLAND MARKET SEGMENTATION

- 1.30 Sport England Market Segmentation data models particular groups and provides information on sporting behaviors and attitudes as well as motivations for and barriers to taking part in sport. This research builds upon the Active People Survey, the Department for Culture Media and Sport's Taking Part Survey and Mosaic tool from Experian. Each market segment profile uses a male or female name.
- 1.31 The most prevalent Sport England market segment in the district with 10.4% is Philip.

PLAYING PITCH AND SPORTS FACILITY ASSESSMENT 2014

- 1.32 Philip is a 'comfortable mid-life male' who is mainly aged 46-55 and is married with children. Philip is in full time employment and an owner occupier. Philip's sporting activity levels are above the national levels with cycling, swimming, gym and football the top sports that Philip participates in. So the use of swimming pools, fitness facilities and playing pitches are very important to Philip.
- 1.33 The next prevailing segment is Elsie and Arnold who are 'retirement home singles' aged 66+ and are likely to be retired singles or widowers, predominantly female, living in sheltered accommodation. They are less active than the rest of the population but still like to take part in keep fit, swimming and bowls. The facilities used by this segment will be swimming pools, facilities for keep fit and indoor and outdoor bowls facilities.
- 1.34 The third prevailing market segment is Jackie. Jackie is classed as a middle England mum – and she is likely to be married with children. The top sports that Jackie participates in are keep fit, and swimming and she may also play badminton, tennis or netball. The facilities that Jackie would use are swimming pools, indoor sports halls for badminton and outdoor tennis and netball courts.

2. Assessment of Need

SWIMMING POOLS

- 2.1 The National Facilities Strategy for Swimming (December 2002) states that 'within every local authority area, there is a requirement for at least one 25-metre 6 lane swimming pool with timing equipment and adequate accommodation for competitors and spectators to stage local galas and events.'
- 2.2 The new 25m 6 lane swimming pool at Gosport Leisure Centre opened in 2012 meets the above requirements. In addition the new Gosport Leisure Centre has a 12m teaching pool.
- 2.3 The Amateur Swimming Association and Hampshire County Council have carried out an analysis of swimming pool provision across Hampshire including Gosport in 2013 using Sport England's Facilities Planning Model tool (FPM).
- 2.4 The FPM considers supply and demand which is exported and imported and the hours that swimming pools are open.
- 2.5 From consultation with the persons responsible for the Hampshire report following the FPM run the following has been stated:

'There is a slight deficit but no need for another pool in Gosport Borough.'

2.6 The new Gosport Leisure Centre swimming pool meets a majority of the deficit, but there is also a need to increase access to local school pools. Brune Park Swimming Pool apart from swim schools is currently offering adult swim and family swim sessions. Leesland Schools Federation has an 18 metre swimming pool which is hired out to local organisations for lessons and other activities outside of the school curriculum.

SPORTS HALLS

- 2.7 The audit of sports halls has been provided by Sport England's Active Places (SPOGO) and supplemented with more up to date local information. The audit identifies the following Sports Halls in Gosport. These are:
 - Gosport Leisure Centre 4 badminton court hall
 - Brune Park School 4 badminton court hall
 - Bay House School 4 badminton court hall (Planning Permission has been granted for a new sports hall to replace an existing temporary sports hall)
 - Bridgemary School 4 Badminton Court hall
 - St Vincent's School 4 Badminton Court hall
 - Alverstoke Lawn Tennis, Squash and Badminton Club Indoor tennis court is used as 4 badminton courts.

- 2.8 The total number of badminton courts in Gosport in 2013 equates to 24 badminton courts and 6 sports halls.
- 2.9 Sport England Facilities Calculator Tool (SFC) can be used to assess the current supply of sports hall badminton court space. The SFC considers the age profile and size of a local population and provides an estimate of the level of provision which should be available to meet the needs of that population.
- 2.10 The SFC does not take into account, actual usage levels of facilities, the quality, accessibility or other demand which may be imported or exported to neighbouring local authorities.
- 2.11 Table 2.1 provides information on the Sports Facility Calculator for badminton courts for sports halls where by a 4 court badminton hall equates to one sports hall.

- 2.12 The SFC suggests that by 2021 there will be a surplus of badminton courts equating to 0.68 badminton courts. The SFC does not reflect level of usage and quality of facilities such as the new facilities at the Gosport Leisure Centre.
- 2.13 Sports hall and badminton space will need to be monitored but at this stage there is no recommendation for any further facilities.

HEALTH AND FITNESS

- 2.14 The **2013 State of the UK Fitness Industry Report** reveals that the UK health and fitness industry has grown its total market value by 1.5% to £3.92 billion over the twelve month period to the end of March 2013.
- 2.15 The 2013 report highlights that the industry has experienced improved growth in the last twelve months with increases of 1.5% in value, 2% in the number of fitness facilities and a 4.5% rise in the number of members, according to independent leisure market analysts The Leisure Database Company.
- 2.16 Now in the middle of a recessionary period, the fitness sector is still expanding despite the economic slowdown. Since 2009, the fitness industry has grown its total market value by 4%, the member base by 8.3% and the number of fitness facilities by 3.9%.
- 2.17 The growth in the industry has been driven by strong performance from both private and public fitness facilities but especially from the rapidly growing private low cost market.

- 2.18 The private low cost sector saw significant growth across the three key performance indicators number of clubs, member numbers and total market value.
- 2.19 This rapidly expanding market now accounts for 6% of the total number of private clubs, 6% of the private market value and an impressive 14% of the private sector membership.
- 2.20 The low cost operators are having an impact on both average monthly membership fees and the yield per member across the industry.
- 2.21 Summary of Key Facts:
 - Total Market Value (public and private sectors combined) is estimated at £3.92 billion, up 1.5% on 2012.
 - 12.6% of the UK population are now registered as members of a private health and fitness club or a publicly-owned fitness facility contrasting with 12.1% in the previous year.
 - Total industry membership base is the strongest growth indicator, up 4.5% to 7.9 million over the past 12 months.
 - 167 new public and private fitness facilities opened in the 12 month period ending 31st March 2013, up from 163 in 2012, 149 in 2011 and 122 in 2010.
 - There are now 6,019 fitness facilities in the UK, up from 5,900 last year.

GOSPORT HEALTH AND FITNESS DEMAND AND SUPPLY

- 2.22 The parameters for measuring the number of health and fitness stations (individual pieces of equipment) necessary to meet demand are different again. The total number of stations required to supply current demand based on the Fitness Industry Association current penetration rate for 2013 of 12.6% in Gosport is **247** stations (See Appendix 1).
- 2.23 There are currently a total of **269 stations** across all sectors in Gosport thus showing a theoretical surplus in supply of **22** stations.
- 2.24 Based on trends in participation and population it is anticipated that by 2021 the demand will have decreased to **243** stations which gives a total surplus against current supply of **26** health and fitness stations. (See Appendix 2)
- 2.25 Bay House School has recently been given planning permission for a health and fitness suite of 150 sq m. At 5 sq m per fitness station this could equate to 30 health and fitness stations. This equates to a possible additional 24 stations across Gosport totaling 293 stations.

INDOOR BOWLS

2.26 There are no indoor bowls facilities identified in Gosport. The Sports Facilities Calculator Tool (SFC) can be used to assess the current supply of Indoors bowls provision.

- 2.27 The SFC considers the age profile and size of a local population and provides an estimate of the level of provision which should be available to meet the needs of that population. The SFC does not take into account, actual usage levels of facilities, the quality, accessibility or other demand which may be imported or exported to neighbouring local authorities.
- 2.28 Table 2.2 provides information on the Sports Facility Calculator for Gosport for Indoor Bowls facilities.

2.29 The SFC identifies that there is a current need for 0.96 of a six rink indoor bowls facility in Gosport future provision in 2021 is 0.90 six rink bowls facility.

SQUASH COURTS

- 2.30 The audit of squash courts identified the following squash facilities in Gosport:
 - Lee Tennis and Squash Club 6 courts
 - Alverstoke Lawn Tennis, Squash and Badminton Club 2 courts
- 2.31 Overall quality of squash facilities ranges from good at Alverstoke Lawn Tennis, Squash and Badminton Club and very good at Lee Tennis and Squash Club.
- 2.32 There is sufficient supply of squash courts to meet demand.

SUMMARY OF SUPPLY AND DEMAND ASSESSMENT OF INDOOR SPORTS PROVISION

- 2.33 The assessment of supply and demand for sport and leisure facilities in Gosport has highlighted a number of considerations for the future:
 - There is no immediate requirement to provide new swimming pool water space but to improve access to existing school facilities.
 - There is not a significant identified under supply of courts/sports halls in the Borough.
 - There is no need to increase fitness facilities in the Borough.
 - There is the potential for an indoor bowls facility.
 - There are currently sufficient squash courts to meet demand.

3. Playing Pitch Assessment

INTRODUCTION

- 3.1 This Playing Pitch assessment provides an update to the 2008 Playing Pitch Assessment and an analysis of the current level of pitch provision within the local authority area of Gosport Borough Council. The report follows the methodology recommended by Sport England as set out in the publication, "Towards a Level Playing Field". In addition aspects of the new pending Sport England Methodology have been taken into consideration, namely the quality audits.
- 3.2 Consultation has been made with the Football Association, Rugby Football Union Facility and Investment Managers for Gosport. Consultation has been undertaken with the Hampshire Cricket Development Manager responsible for Gosport and the Hockey Relationship Manager for Gosport.
- 3.3 The key objectives of this study are:
 - To analyse and assess the current level and quality of pitch provision in Gosport;
 - Identify levels of demand for pitches and identify any surplus or deficit in Gosport;
 - Provide strategic options and recommendations for future pitch provision in Gosport.
- 3.4 The Playing Pitch Assessment has concentrated on adult and young people participation in:
 - Football (competitive association football)
 - Cricket
 - Rugby Union
 - Hockey
- 3.5 The Playing Pitch assessment also considers the non sports pitch sports of Bowls, Tennis and Netball.
- 3.6 The key drivers for this assessment are:
 - To inform decision making processes relating to the provision of playing pitches both now, and as the population grows and the profile of the population changes in Gosport to 2021.
 - Gosport Borough Council is in a challenging financial environment and needs to work in partnership with all Playing Pitch Stakeholders to be able to deliver the requirements for playing pitches to the community in the future.

THE APPROACH

- 3.7 The approach undertaken is in line with Sport England's Towards a Level Playing Field Methodology. However, concerns were raised by Sport England that the New Sport England Methodology should be used. A final decision was taken to take a hybrid approach to the Playing Pitch Assessment as the new Sport England Methodology as yet had not been finally released.
- 3.8 The approach included:
 - A full audit of teams for football, cricket, rugby and hockey playing or wishing to play within the authority boundary;
 - Identification of all sites containing formal playing fields and quality assessments of all community use pitches in the Borough;
 - A full programme of consultation with local clubs, league secretaries, National Governing Bodies of Sport and external stakeholders;
 - Application and interpretation of the Playing Pitch Methodology an eight stage calculation process to identify the adequacy of pitch provision in terms of quality and quantity; and
 - Identification of key issues for pitch provision in the borough.

HOW THE METHODOLOGY WORKS

- 3.9 The overall aim of the assessment methodology is to determine the number of pitches required for each specific sport (Football, Cricket, Rugby Union, & Hockey) to meet demand or a predicted set of circumstances, for e.g. future population projections.
- 3.10 Ascertaining accurate supply and demand information is critical in producing a robust, accurate strategy, which is 'owned' by all stakeholders.
- 3.11 The methodology for assessing local playing pitch provision comprises of an eight- stage approach, as summarised in table 3.1. This methodology is designed for use in football, rugby, cricket and hockey.

Stage 1Identification of the number of teamsThe team is the most basic unit of demand. Demand is established through a count of the number of teams for each sport using a variety of information sources, including pitch booking records, league handbooks, and a club survey. Latent demand and the impact of future population projections should also be considered. In this study the future levels of demand have been assessed, together with current latent demand through analysis of the questionnaire information returned.	Stage	Description and Key Output

ASSESSMENT OF SUPPLY

- 3.12 The current supply of pitches was established through undertaking a series of data review, research and consultation exercises. These consisted of:
 - Review of information held by GBC
 - Audit of pitches owned and managed by GBC, and other providers at local level with identified community use
 - Consultation with key stakeholders (e.g. Governing Bodies of Sport)
 - A postal survey of all schools within the authority
 - A postal survey to all identified Sports Clubs as agreed with GBC
 - Consultation with relevant neighbouring authorities

ASSESSMENT OF DEMAND

- 3.13 The current demand for pitches was established through undertaking a series of research and consultation exercises. These consisted of:
 - An initial sports club questionnaire sent to identified clubs within the authority area (and a number located just outside of the boundary).
 - Additional telephone consultation with key sports clubs.
 - Booking information from pitch sites within the authority area.
 - Analysis of local League handbooks.
 - Consultation with governing bodies of sport.

DATA COLLECTION ISSUES

- 3.14 Establishing precisely how many pitches and teams are within the study area is difficult for a number of reasons including:
 - The number of pitches at a given site can fluctuate over short periods of time for reasons relating to management and husbandry. This means that the findings of a count conducted in one season may differ from results of similar exercise conducted previously or in future seasons. A specific example might relate to a sports and social club opting to supply a specific type of pitch because it yields a greater income potential, e.g. football rather than rugby or cricket.
 - The time at which site surveys are conducted will greatly influence the number of pitches identified through site investigation. This factor was not a major issue in relation to football, given that the majority of site visits were conducted at the commencement of the football season. However, cricket pitch locations are not always apparent outside of the playing season.

- Although the inspection programme helps to provide a consistent comparison across the Borough, it may be difficult to compare quality against other authorities if inspections have been undertaken at different times.
- Mini football matches often make use of portable goals. This can make pitches difficult to identify though a site visit.
- 3.15 For the reasons stated previously the assessment of playing pitch supply and demand within the study area can only be considered to be a "snapshot" in time. There is a need to ensure that the data used within the assessment is updated at appropriate intervals to ensure the ongoing validity of the recommendations made.

DATA ANALYSIS

- 3.16 A key component of the analysis of data was an examination of the extent to which pitches identified were in secured public use. This was undertaken in the context of the Sport England definition of community use, and broadly embraces:
 - All local authority pitches (Gosport BC)
 - Educational facilities where they are subject to formal dual use / community use agreements / formal hire arrangements with local teams. This was assessed through a specific question on the Schools Questionnaire.
 - Any other institutional facilities which are available to the public as a result of formal dual / community use agreements.
 - Any facilities owned, used or maintained by clubs/private individuals, which as a matter of policy or practice are available by large sections of the public through membership of a club or admission fees.
 - Only formal playing pitches that are marked out and in use for the relevant pitch sports have been included in the audit of facilities.
- 3.17 Team Generation Rates (TGRs) have also been considered in the assessment of future needs for playing pitch provision. A TGR is the ratio of the number of teams within a given area to the total population within a given age group from that same area. The groupings which have been used reflect age groups participating in the different sub-groups of each of the assessed sports. (e.g. 6-9 year olds for Mini Soccer).
- 3.18 Identifying TGR's provides the means to:
 - Compare participation in the assessed sports between the study area and other parts of the country where TGR's have formed part of Playing Pitch Strategy developments.
 - Assist in modeling future demand for pitches.

3.19 The use of TGR's needs to be treated with caution. It is important to make use of them as a guide only and not at the expense of using qualitative evidence gathered as part of the study. Essentially, TGR's reflect the current situation and are based on current demand information. They may not include potential / latent demand where teams may for example not be able to develop due to lack of a suitable facility.

INCLUSIONS, EXCLUSIONS AND EXCEPTIONS – SPORT ON A LOCAL LEVEL

- 3.20 The facilities not covered by assessment can be identified as follows:
 - Industrial facilities which are reserved for the team associated with the site.
 - Educational establishment facilities, which have no formal community use agreement and are not available for hire by the public.
 - Professional or semi-professional stadia/pitches, which are generally used by a specific team for elite use, e.g. Gosport Borough Stadium.
 - All other sports pitches which are not available for public use e.g. Prison Service, Military/MOD. In the case of the Gosport Borough assessment, a number of pitches exist on local MOD sites. Where there is no formal use, the pitches have not been included in assessment calculations. A number of pitches have limited use and have been assessed through application of a number of modeling scenarios.
- 3.21 The facilities that are included in the assessment can be identified as follows:
 - Local Authority owned facilities, which have established community access arrangements.
 - Educational establishment facilities which have formal community use agreement and are available for hire by the public.
 - Voluntary and private facilities which are available to the public to hire.
 - Private clubs who own their own grounds, but who have open membership.
 - MOD sites where there is formal community use by local teams.
- 3.22 It is more difficult to apply strict criteria to the assessment of demand. Many teams and sports clubs are comprised of members that live in neighbouring areas or settlements so it is not always easy to identify "where" a team comes from. Inevitably there are some "grey areas" relating to some clubs and whether they should be included within the assessment or not. It is important that the assessment reflects the way sport operates on a local level. As a result, some assumptions have been made within the assessment.

AUDIT OF CURRENT SUPPLY

OVERVIEW

- 3.23 Playing pitch supply in the Gosport Borough is made through a number of providers. These include:
 - Gosport Borough Council (GBC)
 - Education Sites (schools and colleges)
 - Other Public Agency providers / Private/ Voluntary Sports Clubs (e.g. MOD Sites, Fleetlands FC).
- 3.24 Each of the individual providers of playing pitches can be defined in the following way:
 - **Gosport Borough Council:** The main provider of playing pitches courts and greens on public open spaces within the Borough. The majoritiy of these pitches are within informal recreational land and are only defined as playing pitches during the time at which they are booked for formal sporting fixtures. The rest of the time these pitches are used as informal recreational space, and are available for use by any member of the public, including informal sports use, dog walking and formal event bookings.
 - Education Sites: School playing fields are provided primarily for physical education and the enjoyment of young people attending school and College. These pitches are not always available to the local community to access on a formal and informal basis. The local management of schools has meant that some schools make their facilities available to the local community and others do not. This can result in significant playing pitch resources within local communities not being available for the local community to use. In the case of Gosport there are four schools/colleges that provide a level of community use either for training purposes or for league competition. For instance on a Sunday the only education sites that provide facilities for the Gosport, Fareham and Solent Sunday Football League in the 2013/14 football season are Brune Park, and St Vincent's.
 - Other Sites: These are principally made up of MOD sites. A number of pitches are provided for community use at Arden Park, and Fort Monkton. HMS Sultan occasionally provides for the needs of community clubs if they can afford to access the facilities. Fleetland's provide for the needs of MOD teams only. The Gosport, Fareham and Solent League enquired about use of MOD football pitches for the 2013/14 season. The League was informed that each club using the MOD pitches would have to pay license charges which could be for a one off event or a series of events over an agreed period of time on top of the playing pitch hire. This has made these pitches inaccessible for the League.

QUANTITY

3.25 The audit of pitches identified that there are 21 playing pitch sites and 81 playing pitches (Football, Cricket, Rugby Union, and Hockey - Full size artificial turf pitch) within the Gosport BC boundary. A detailed list of sites is provided in Appendix 3 for all pitches currently used.

3.26 This pitch supply is made up of the following:

- 3.27 The total of 81 pitches in Figure 3.2 above includes two training pitches but excludes two 5 v 5 pitches with planning permission at Gosport Leisure Centre.
- 3.28 GBC is the main provider of pitches (61% of all community accessible pitches), although education sites (21%) and other sites (18%) are also important. This emphasises the need to work in partnership with other providers to ensure access for local teams, and the importance in maintaining access to those pitches provided by other agencies.

QUALITY

- 3.29 The quality of playing pitches was also assessed through:
 - Site visits and a non-technical turf pitch quality assessment (PQA) of all pitches identified as having secured community use (based on a visual inspection) and being in Council Ownership
 - Self ratings by schools of their own facilities
 - Ratings by local clubs of the facilities they use

NON-TECHNICAL VISUAL ASSESSMENTS

- 3.30 For the non technical turf quality assessment, the quality sheets devised by the National Governing Body's and Sport England for the new emerging playing pitch methodology were used.
- 3.31 These can be found as Appendix 5 Football, Appendix 6 Rugby Union and Appendix 7 cricket. Site visits were made in April for football, rugby and hockey and in June for Cricket.
- 3.32 Appendix 8 provides the quality scores for all pitches. All pitches were rated using the Sport England and National Governing Body scoring matrixes:

3.33 Quality of all pitches rated varied from:

- Football Poor Standard
- Cricket Standard Good
- Rugby Union Excellent
- Hockey Poor
- 3.34 The football pitches rated as poor are at Stokes Bay. The hockey pitch rated as poor is at St Vincent's.
- 3.35 In addition a number of changing rooms require refurbishment, Brookers Field and Elson.

CONSULTATION WITH SCHOOLS/COLLEGES - SELF-RATINGS OF SCHOOL/COLLEGE FACILITIES

3.36 Schools/colleges providing community use in the Borough were consulted about their pitch facilities, including a self-rating of the quality of pitches on their site. Only 4 schools/colleges with playing pitch facilities were identified as providing community use. Of these, all provided a rating of the quality of the on-site pitches. Three schools/colleges rated their facilities as "Excellent" to "Good" Brune Park, Bay House and St Vincent's. One school rated their facilities as average Lee on-the-Solent Junior and Infant School.

CONSULTATION WITH SPORTS CLUBS – RATINGS OF FACILITIES USED

- 3.37 A consultation exercise was undertaken with all identified sports pitch clubs within the Gosport Borough Council boundary. The initial response rate to the survey was poor and was subsequently boosted through telephone surveys undertaken by Strategic Leisure Limited. The overall response rate was 70%. The responding clubs rated facilities they used as follows:
 - 10 % of respondents rated pitches as "excellent"
 - 32 % rated pitches "good"
 - 37% rated pitches as "average"
 - 21% rated pitches as "poor" or "very poor"

- 3.38 The results show that overall views on quality were positive, with 42% rating facilities as "excellent" or "good". 37% average and 21% poor.
- 3.39 Results from sports specific clubs (i.e. football, cricket etc...) are reported within the sport by sport assessment.
- 3.40 Stokes Bay and Grange Lane football pitches are rated as poor. All other football pitches in Gosport and under the control of Gosport Borough Council are rated as Standard and the pitch quality scores vary between 57% and 73%.
- 3.41 The audit identifies Stokes Bay Football Pitches as the poorest pitches in Gosport and care will need to be taken with the carrying Capacity (Number of games played per week at this site). It would be prudent to rest a minimum of 1 pitch a week at this site. The remaining Gosport Council Pitches can carry up to 3 games per week.

AUDIT OF CURRENT DEMAND

3.42 The following numbers of clubs and teams have been identified as playing regular fixtures throughout the relevant season;

SPORT BY SPORT ASSESSMENTS – KEY FINDINGS

3.43 The findings of the assessment of playing pitch provision are considered on a sport-by-sport basis, in relation to Football, Cricket, Rugby Union, and Hockey. No other key pitch sports, for example, Gaelic Football, Rugby League or Lacrosse were identified.

PLAYING PITCH AND SPORTS FACILITY ASSESSMENT 2014



- 3.44 The Football Association is the governing body responsible for football in England. Facility improvement will be a focus in delivering their 'Whole Sport Plan 2013 2017' and will underpin the different programmes being rolled out to drive participation. A sum of £30 million has been set aside for investment in football and multi-sport facilities via Sport England and the Football Association.
- 3.45 The Hampshire County Football association who have responsibility for football in Gosport and the teams that play in Gosport affiliate to Hampshire County Football Association.
- 3.46 The Hampshire FA's strategy for investment in facilities is in line with the FA's Strategy. The FA's priorities for 2013 to 2015 are as follows:
 - Natural grass pitch improvements and maintenance: Grants will be made to support the development of new and improved natural grass pitches. Additional support will be made available to clubs wishing to develop their own skills in the future maintenance of natural grass, through relevant training and advice.
 - **Development of new Artificial Grass Pitches:** The latest Artificial Grass Pitches are capable of carrying much greater activity than natural grass. An increasing number of leagues are allowing games to be played on these surfaces and many grassroots clubs compete to access them for training purposes. The FA estimates that a typical full-sized floodlit AGP can accommodate the training needs of up to 60 teams in any given week let alone wider use for matches and informal participation. The FA will continue to work with Leagues and Competitions to encourage appropriate use of AGPs.
 - **Refurbishment of old Artificial Grass Pitches:** The FA will work closely with other relevant National Governing Bodies and map out priority sites where existing old-style pitches might be replaced to reflect local need / demand. This will offer a value for money approach to sustaining and growing participation and at the same time create a financially sustainable network of AGP sites in England.

- **Provision of suitable changing accommodation and toilet facilities:** The FA will seek to ensure that suitable proposals for improvements to changing rooms and associated facilities are properly assessed against need and value for money and that standards are put in place that are consistent with the needs of clubs at all levels. New construction methods will be assessed and implemented where these meet with local needs and are cost effective.
- Small Grants Programme for modest facility improvements: This programme will continue and will aim to address the often very basic facility requirements of clubs. The FA and Football Foundation will set down some broad guidelines for access to this funding although the intention will be to minimise red-tape and keep access as open as possible.
- **New/replacement goalposts:** In support of the proposed implementation of 9v9 football and other flexible formats of the game, a dedicated fund for new/replacement goalposts will be established through the Football Foundation. The FA will also ensure that awareness regarding goalpost safety is refreshed and publicised. Funding to replace unsafe goalposts will continue.
- 3.47 Every year the Football Association (FA) produce a local participation report showing how many people participate in football in the local area. According to the 2012/13 report, 5.3% of the adult population (16+) in Gosport participate in football for at least 30 minutes once a week, compared to a national average of 4.96% (Sport England Active People Survey 2012).
- 3.48 The 2012/13 report also shows that Gosport has a total of 50 affiliated clubs with a total of 125 teams of which 125 play in Gosport. Of the 125 teams operating in Gosport, 51 (40.8%) are adult teams, 37 (29.6%) are youth teams (all formats) and 37 (29.6%) are Mini-Soccer teams and 56.8% or 42 of the 74 Youth and Mini-soccer teams play in a club that has achieved a Charter Standard Award as compared to a national average of 78.3%. The number of teams has increased by 5 teams overall in Gosport from season 11/12 to season 12/13.
- 3.49 The number of affiliated clubs and teams is different to those in table 3.3 and 3.4 The FA Report identifies clubs and teams from 2012/13 season not the current 2013/14 season which are included in table 3.3 and 3.4. The FA Report 2012/13 season has been shown to show the level of demand prior to the amalgamation of the leagues.

CHANGES IN FOOTBALL 2013/14 SEASON

- 3.50 A major change has occurred within the Gosport football League set up for the 2013/14 football season. The amalgamation of two Sunday Leagues the Gosport and Fareham Sunday Football League and the Mid Solent Football League to become the Gosport and Fareham Solent League has occurred.
- 3.51 With the formation of the new Gosport and Fareham Solent League it was considered appropriate to research the Football Clubs and teams playing in Gosport for the current 2013/14 football season. The research includes information from the FA Find a club web site and the Gosport and Fareham Solent League web site to ensure that the Football Assessment is as up to date as possible from the 2013/14 season and considers the amalgamation of the two Sunday Leagues. This information was then agreed with the Hampshire Football Association.

- 3.52 The research has identified that there are 59 teams in the new Gosport and Fareham Solent League for the 2013/14 season and that 36 of these are from Gosport. From the Leagues fixtures list it can also be identified that on average the League will be using 20 pitches from Gosport on a weekly basis to fulfill its football league fixtures and some cup games. The average 20 pitches used each week are 2 pitches above the requirements of Gosport teams (18 pitches each week).
- 3.53 The study research for the 2013/14 season has identified **47** football clubs generating **119** teams. The number of teams generated by each club varies significantly, from single team clubs to those with in excess of ten teams. These teams are detailed by the number within each identified "type" of team in table 3.4 overleaf.

- 3.54 The drop in the number of teams compared to the numbers stated in Paragraph 3.49 identified by the FA in the 2012/13 season is mainly due to the amalgamation of the two Sunday leagues.
- 3.55 The closure of the Civil Service Sports Ground is also likely to have had an effect on the number of teams in the Borough. The use of the site for sports use ended at the close of the 2012 /13 football season and the owners have no intention for the site to be used for pitches.
- 3.56 The FA believes that the amalgamation of the two Sunday football leagues will ensure the sustainability of adult football in Gosport for the foreseeable future. It is believed that the new Gosport and Fareham Solent League will grow in team numbers again over the coming seasons.
- 3.57 Gosport MOD football teams have also depleted in 2013. In 2011 there were 7 MOD football teams playing all of which were men's teams. In 2013 there are 4 men's teams and 1 women's team.
- 3.58 Table 3.5 shows the number of football pitches being used but these football pitches do not all provide for secure community use.

- 3.59 There are 5 more mini soccer pitches in 2013 then there was in 2008, 9 more junior pitches all formats this is mainly due to the changes in the Football Associations Youth Format from the 2013/14 season and Gosport Council supplying additional youth format pitches for the 2013/14 season to meet the new youth size of pitch rules e.g. 7 v 7 and 9 v 9.
- 3.60 There are 6 less senior pitches. The loss of the senior pitches from the model is attributable to the closure of the Civil Service Sports Ground and the new owners not providing any facilities. The second reason is the MOD pitches that were in the 2008 model no longer have community use and only provide for MOD competitive team use.
- 3.61 The two pitches lost due to the new leisure centre at Holbrook have been relocated elsewhere in the Borough (Grange Lane and Stokes Bay).
- 3.62 Appendix 4 shows the PPM Gosport 2013 2021 Providing Secured and Unsecured Community use Playing Pitches with Gosport Housing Population Data 2021. Appendix 4 takes into consideration all the unsecured pitches in Table 3.5.

PRESSURE ON COUNCIL FOOTBALL PLAYING PITCH FACILITIES

- 3.63 There is now even more pressure on Council Playing Pitch facilities in particular senior adult pitches on a Sunday.
- 3.64 The reasons for this pressure are:
 - The pitches that are available on school sites are not guaranteed as community use. Consultation with Gosport, Fareham and Solent Sunday League has identified that Bay House School pitches are now being used by Portsmouth Academy and are now not available for community use. The only school pitches available to the league for uses are St Vincent's College and Brune Park Schools.
 - The pitches in use on certain MOD sites are only now being used by MOD competitive teams in midweek. Consultation has identified that the MOD is charging £150.00 for each individual team for license charges which could be for a one off event or a series of events over an agreed period of time on top of the playing pitch hire. This prohibits the use of the MOD pitches by community clubs.
 - In addition the closure of the Civil Service Sports Ground has reduced the number of pitches available.
 - Other facilities such as Monkton and Arden Park are leased to clubs by the MOD and these clubs do not permit use of their senior pitches to other clubs or teams on Sunday's and do not currently play in the Gosport, Fareham and Solent Sunday League.
- 3.65 The study has identified that the highest use of senior pitches is on a Sunday and used by the Gosport, Fareham and Solent League.
- 3.66 Appendix 4 PPM Gosport 2013 2021 Providing Secured and Unsecured Community use Playing Pitches with Gosport Housing Population Data 2021 shows all senior pitches available for use and calculates the PPM applying the 34 senior pitches in the supply table.

- 3.67 Appendix 4a PPM Gosport 2013 2021 Providing only Secured Community Use Playing Pitches with Gosport Housing Population Data 2021 shows only those pitches that have secured community use e.g. Gosport Borough Council Senior pitches and Brune Park and St Vincent's Schools senior pitches. There is a reduction of 12 senior pitches from Appendix 4 to Appendix 4a.
- 3.68 The Council and the Gosport, Fareham and Solent Football League have no control over the use of the 12 pitches that are supposed to be available for community use but not secured community use. These 12 senior pitches have been removed from Appendix 4a to provide a clearer picture of the surplus and deficit of senior pitches on a Sunday in Gosport.
- 3.69 By removing the 12 pitches from the supply in the Playing Pitch Model Appendix 4a. This reduces the surplus to 4.1 senior pitches on a Sunday in 2013 (Appendix 4 Sheet PPM Current Population Row 6 Column AR and 3.5 in 2021 (Appendix 4 Sheet PPM Future Population Row 6 Column AU.
- 3.70 After discussion with the Hampshire FA it was decided to put in place a 10% increase in the number of teams for senior and junior football (all formats) and split this 50/50. This allows for the new Sunday League to grow and the anticipated up take in the new junior format.
- 3.71 A strategic reserve which is another important consideration with grass pitches allows pitches to be 'rested' on a weekly or seasonal basis, to allow playing surfaces to recover and regenerate. As a general rule, the strategic reserve should comprise a minimum of 10% of the number of pitches required at the peak demand period. This means that 10% of the secured community use senior pitches of which there are 22 should be set aside each week for resting. This equates to 2.2 pitches.
- 3.72 The current surplus in 2013 equates to 4.1 senior pitches (Paragraph 3.69). If you subtract the 2.2 pitches that should be resting this only leaves a surplus of 1.9 Senior Pitches in 2013. In 2021 the surplus of 3.5 when considering the resting of pitches will leave a surplus of 1.3 senior pitches.

QUALITY OF PITCHES

- 3.73 Stokes Bay and Grange Lane football pitches are rated as poor. All other football pitches in Gosport and under the control of Gosport Borough Council are rated as Standard and the pitch quality scores vary between 57% and 73% for standard rated pitches.
- 3.74 The audit identifies Stokes Bay Football Pitches as the poorest quality pitches in Gosport and care will need to be taken with the carrying Capacity (Number of games played per week at this site). It would be prudent to rest a minimum of 1 pitch a week at this site.
- 3.75 Site assessments suggest the quality of the pitches has broadly remained the same as 2008 generally good with drainage improvements having taken place at Brookers Field since the 2008 report.
- 3.76 The other main change to have occurred since 2008 is that the pitches at the Civil Service Sports Ground are no longer being used as sports pitches. This use was terminated at the end of the 2012/13 football season, following a season when the pitches had been fully utilised for football.

- 3.77 According to the 2008 Report these pitches were some of the best in the Borough with an 81% rating for football pitch quality (which made it the second best football pitch in the Borough) and 71% for the ancillary facilities. These ancillary facilities have since been demolished. It could be argued that the quality of the Civil Service pitches and ancillary facilities now closed outstripped the quality of those at Stokes Bay. The Council should put in place a policy that retains the pitches at the Civil Service Sports Ground and other quality sports pitches within the Borough.
- 3.78 Due to the openness of some facilities dog fouling and some unofficial use has been highlighted and the lack of car parking is an issue at some sites. Brookers Field has an issue with animals digging up the drainage that has been put in.
- 3.79 A number of changing facilities require refurbishment work to allow mixed gender and multi age groups to use a site simultaneously.
- 3.80 A number of clubs that have their own pitches/grounds still use school facilities to train on during the week and some Saturday mornings. Gosport Borough Youth for instance use 4 school playing fields to train on during the week and Gosport Youth FC use St Vincent's as well as having 2 training pitches at Arden Park.
- 3.81 The survey did not pick up on significant training being undertaken on grass pitches. Training tends to take place on school playing fields that are not used for competitive games, or in sports halls or AGPs at St Vincent's. In this instance there is a need for additional Artificial Grass Turf for training and competitive play.

TEAM GENERATION RATES

3.82 Team Generation Rates are expressed as Teams per 1,000 population in age group. Table 3.6 below shows the team generation rates for Gosport.

CURRENT SUPPLY AND DEMAND

3.83 There are two assessments that have been worked through as part of this study. Appendix 4 identifies supply and demand utilising all available football pitches that are currently available and have been audited (Secured and Unsecured Community Use). Appendix 4a utilises known guaranteed community use pitches available for Football and provides the most realistic picture of supply and demand (Secured Community Use).

- 3.84 Both appendices use the Gosport Borough Population projections taking the required new housing into consideration up to 2021.
- 3.85 The following information is therefore taken from Appendix 4a. Providing Secured Community Use Playing Pitches
- 3.86 Temporal Demand for Games. The assessment reveals that most games are played on a Sunday (82% of all senior games, 55% junior games and 55% for mini soccer).
- 3.87 Current Supply and Demand Assessment: Mini Soccer The quantitative assessment has revealed that there is a surplus of 6.5 mini soccer pitches in 2013. The surplus would reduce by 3 pitches if 10% of pitches were rested to recuperate. The projected surplus in 2021 is 6.4 mini soccer pitches.
- 3.88 Current Supply and Demand Assessment: Junior / Youth Football The quantitative assessment has revealed that there is a surplus of 1.5 junior football pitches all formats provision to meet peak demand on a Sunday morning in 2013. The surplus changes to 0 in 2021. If 10% of pitches were rested to allow for pitches to recuperate this would account for 1.3 pitches in 2013. There would not be a surplus to allow for the resting of junior pitches in 2021.
- 3.89 Current Supply and Demand Assessment: Senior Football The quantitative assessment has revealed that there is a moderate theoretical surplus of +4.1 senior pitches to meet peak demand in senior football on a Sunday morning in 2013 (using secured community use facilities only). The surplus changes to 3.5 senior pitches in 2021.
- 3.90 If 10% of senior pitches available on Sunday were rested this would equate to 2 of the surplus pitches. In addition, the poor quality of the pitches at Stokes Bay needs to be considered.
- 3.91 When the Education, MOD and Private senior pitch sites are taken out of the equation. It is clear that the Council sites are at capacity on a Sunday with senior football.

TEAM EQUIVALENTS

- 3.92 In addition to the teams requiring access to pitches to play competitive fixtures, the impact on overall demand from training use can be assessed by calculating the 'team equivalents' that such usage generates. Team equivalents are therefore a measure of the additional demand for access to pitches
- 3.93 There appears to be very little training if any on the competitive community use pitches. Due to the lack of 3rd Generation rubber crumb Artificial Grass pitches in Gosport clubs use school playing fields, sports halls and sand based artificial grass pitches at St Vincent's College for Training.
- 3.94 The Football Association is supporting the development of a 3G rubber Crumb pitch at Bridgemary School. This development received planning permission on the 17th September 2013 and will provide the much needed additional training facility for football in Gosport.

- 3.95 It is expected that as the amalgamated Gosport, Fareham and Solent League becomes established on Sunday morning over the coming seasons new teams will join and require use of the senior pitch surplus. This will increase the pressure on senior pitches.
- 3.96 For every 2 additional teams there will be a requirement of 1 senior pitch. If the Gosport, Fareham and Solent District League grows by another 6 teams next season there will be a requirement for an additional 3 new senior pitches on a Sunday. Resting of pitches with today's climate is a matter of fact and the position emphasises that it is a Policy requirement of Gosport Borough Council to protect the current playing pitch provision including the Civil Service Sports Ground. Indeed any future loss of playing pitches at Education and MOD establishments including those with community use arrangements and those used solely by the school or MOD should be resisted as these have the potential to be used by the wider community, unless it can be demonstrated there is no long term demand for such a facility.

FOOTBALL SUMMARY - RECOMMENDATIONS AND PRIORITIES

- 3.97 The peak demand for senior football pitches is Sunday morning and the demand for senior Council pitches is high in part due to the Council being the main provider of senior pitches on a Sunday morning.
- 3.98 The current playing pitch stock of football pitches should be protected including MOD sites and the Civil Service Sports Ground (One of the best quality facilities in the Borough in 2008) and consideration should be given to seeking secured community use agreements with schools.
- 3.99 The priority is to maintain use of all football pitch facilities and sports grounds including the Civil Service Sports Ground, MOD and Education Playing facilities. Appendix 4a Providing Secured Playing Pitches shows the true picture of football in particular on a Sunday morning when most senior football is played. This shows a senior pitch current surplus of 4.1 pitches dropping to 3.5 in 2021. These surpluses do not take into consideration the resting of pitches.
- 3.100 The perception from the Hampshire Football Association is that the new Gosport, Fareham and Solent League will be more sustainable than the previous leagues and the new league will grow in stature and encourage more teams to participate in the future and increase the number of teams in the league season by season. The Gosport, Fareham and Solent League have already received 2 new applications on top of the existing League clubs to join the league in 2014/15.
- 3.101 Six new teams in the Gosport, Fareham and Solent League will require 3 new adult pitches.
- 3.102 There are two mini pitches still to be completed at Gosport Leisure Centre as part of the planning permissions.
- 3.103 There is a need to maintain the current level of junior and mini soccer pitches and to ensure that the carrying capacities of the current pitches are maintained. 2013/14 Is the first season of the new Youth format there is a perception that new additional teams will be formed over the coming seasons.
- 3.104 The use of school pitches for training purposes is encouraged e.g. Gosport Youth FC uses St Vincent's and Gosport Borough use four different schools for training.

- 3.105 The recent Planning Permission given to Bridgemary School for a 3G Rubber Crumb All weather floodlit pitch will help the large number of junior and senior teams with much needed additional training facilities and may assist with providing 9 v 9 pitches to assist with back logs of games in a season due to cancellations through water logging of grass pitches.
- 3.106 The majority of Gosport Council owned changing facilities require refurbishment. Any improvements to changing facilities should consider access, with appropriate segregation of gender and match officials and spectators.

RECOMMENDATIONS - FOOTBALL

- F1. Maintain and protect the unsecured community use pitches that exist currently football pitches for future community use including the Civil Service Sports Ground, MOD sites and school and college sites, this will allow for the expansion of the new Gosport, Fareham and Solent League.
- F2. Ensure that 10% of Council owned pitches are rested on a regular basis.
- F3. The quality of Stokes Bay pitches need to be improved, including increasing improve the carrying capacity of the pitches and providing much needed changing facilities. Improvements at Privett Park may be considered a priority to enhance the quality of facilities at this site. This could be carried out by use of Developer Contributions.
- F4. Developer contributions off site could refurbish changing rooms to accommodate male and female and improve drainage at some Council sites in the future

PLAYING PITCH AND SPORTS FACILITY ASSESSMENT 2014



- 3.107 The England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) is the governing body for all cricket in England and Wales. The ECB has a dedicated team who work on all aspects of funding and facilities. Gosport is part of the Hampshire County Cricket governing body. Clubs have access to Hampshire Cricket Leagues.
- 3.108 Gosport Council's Pitch Bookings Officer meets regularly with the Hampshire County Development Officers during the season and has a close working relationship with the main two clubs in Gosport. The research has identified that there are 2 main clubs in Gosport with 14 teams. One of these is a mini and not recorded in table 3.7 below.

- 3.109 The two main teams are Gosport Borough Cricket Club and Rowner Cricket Club. Gosport Borough Cricket Club plays in the Hampshire Cricket League County Division 1. They are however part of the Southern Electric Premier League (SEPL) Grounds Accreditation Scheme as they were only relegated in 2012. These ratings are currently below Bronze Standard (lowest level to play in the SEPL). The SEPL run a warning system to give clubs the opportunity to improve standards. If the club was to be promoted to the SEPL then standards would have to be improved.
- 3.110 Gosport Borough Cricket Club has the most teams and is based at Privett Park. It uses all three squares but its main pitch is Privett 1 adjacent to the club's clubhouse. The club has an under 9s section and a mini cricket section. The club's clubhouse facilities have improved since the last Playing Pitch Assessment, and are now shared with Gosport Borough Hockey Club as a base. The Club has new artificial practice nets and its colts play on the non turf wickets on Pitch 1, 2 and 3 at Privett Park. In terms of Security of Tenure, Hampshire Cricket advises that a more secure lease of the main square (Pitch 1) at Gosport Borough would be appropriate for a club of such standing.

3.111 The second main club is Rowner Cricket Club which has three senior teams and plays at Rowner Fields. The Rowner outfield has an issue with flooding and leveling.

TEAM GENERATION RATES

3.112 Team Generation Rates are expressed as Teams per 1,000 population in age group. Table 3.8 below shows the team generation rates for Gosport. There are no girls or women's cricket teams in Gosport

3.113 Since the last assessment the Civil Service Sports Ground has been closed. The shed used by cricket teams at the Civil Service ground has been burnt down. It is understood the facilities have been purchased and the Playing Fields are not being maintained as sports pitches by the landowner.

3.114 Table 3.9 shows the number of pitches in 2013.

- 3.115 The development of the non turf wicket has allowed the junior teams at Gosport to play without damaging the grass squares and these non turf wickets at Privett Park are used for training, and competitive games. There are no team equivalents for cricket due to the use of the non turf wickets and the artificial nets at Gosport Borough Cricket Club.
- 3.116 Site assessments suggest the quality of the pitches has broadly remained the same as 2008 generally good. However, there are issues at Rowner Field with the outfield flooding. The Civil Service Sports Ground quality rating in 2008 was 78% (Good).

CURRENT SUPPLY AND DEMAND

3.117 Temporal Demand for Games. The assessment reveals that all junior games are played midweek mainly on the non turf wickets.

3.118 Most senior games are played on a Saturday afternoon 50%, Sunday afternoon 30% and midweek 20%. Current Supply and Demand Assessment: Cricket – The quantitative assessment has revealed that there is a moderate theoretical surplus of +2.5 pitches to meet peak demand in cricket.

CRICKET CONCLUSIONS RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.119 The key issues relating to supply and demand of cricket can be summarised as:
 - Current demand is met by the available pitch supply, although demand is split throughout the week which helps ensure pitches are adequate. Future supply is met in 2021 with a surplus of 2.4 pitches.
 - Quality is generally good with most pitches rated "Good" or "Standard". This theoretically improves the capacity of each pitch to accommodate more fixtures. A number of squares have artificial wickets e.g. Privett Park and an artificial wicket at Gosport Park.
 - Gosport Cricket Club has a new clubhouse and artificial cricket nets. The quality ratings for ancillary facilities elsewhere were lower. Privett Park and Rowner Fields Ground changing facilities were all rated lower.
 - Rowner Fields outfield is subject to flooding due to drainage issues and levels.
 - Gosport Borough Council and Rowner Cricket Club require long term leases to guarantee security of tenure.
 - Gosport Borough Cricket Club and Gosport Borough Council need to work together to ensure that Gosport Borough Cricket Club meets the requirements of the SEPL if the club is promoted to the SEPL in the future.

RECOMMENDATIONS - CRICKET

- C1. Existing Cricket pitches should be protected by Planning Policy and the cricket pitch at the Civil Service Sports ground should be retained due to its quality and brought back into use.
- **C2.** The Rowner Field cricket outfield requires drainage improvements. Off site developer contributions would assist in rectifying this issue.
- C3. Developer contributions should be used to refurbish Privett Park Pavilion.



- 3.120 The Rugby Football Union (RFU) is the national governing body for the development of Rugby Union in Gosport. The RFU 'Whole Sport Plan 2013 2017' aims to use the Sport England funding to capitalise on hosting the Rugby World Cup in 2015 and generate more interest in the sport. The funding will be used over the 4 year period to support the RFU's 4 key priorities.
- 3.121 The research has identified that there is 1 main rugby club in Gosport. Gosport and Fareham RFU Club has 17 teams. Table 3.10 below identifies the number of teams by age groups.

- 3.122 Gosport and Fareham RFU are based in Gosport Park they have 3 senior pitches 2 junior pitches and 2 mini pitches. The club has a training pitch with floodlights. The training pitch with floodlights is well used and can look tired at times.
- 3.123 There are no issues around extra space requirements or programming of pitches. The pitches are on common land which the club pays the Council for. All maintenance is carried out by the Council.
- 3.124 All playing surfaces are in good condition and very few matches are ever cancelled.

TEAM GENERATION RATES

3.125 Team Generation Rates are expressed as Teams per 1,000 population in age group. Table 3.11 below shows the team generation rates for Gosport based on 2013.

3.126 There are no girls or women's rugby teams in Gosport.

3.127 Bay House School is considering leveling its 2 rugby pitches.

- 3.129 Site assessments suggest the quality of the pitches at Gosport Park are good and adequate. The Bay House School rugby pitches require leveling and the school is considering undertaking this work.
- 3.130 Gosport and Fareham Rugby Club have a schools liaison officer who goes into schools and encourages the uptake of rugby.

CURRENT SUPPLY AND DEMAND

- 3.131 Temporal Demand for Games. The assessment reveals that all junior games are played on a Sunday and senior's games on a Saturday.
- 3.132 Current Supply and Demand Assessment: Rugby The quantitative assessment has revealed that there is a moderate theoretical surplus of +2 senior pitches and + 0.5 junior pitches to meet peak demand in rugby in 2013. From 2021 there is a deficit of 2.2 junior pitches and a surplus of 2 senior pitches. The two senior pitches at Bay House School could be used to meet this deficit.
- 3.133 Current Team Generation rates (TGR's) are based on the number of teams identified earlier in Figure 2.12 and provides an indication of how many residents (of rugby playing age) are required to generate a rugby team. Detailed calculations are provided in the appendices to this report.

RUGBY CONCLUSIONS RECOMMENDATIONS

SUMMARY

- 3.134 There has been little change with regards to rugby since the 2008 assessment. Gosport and Fareham Rugby Club is the only Rugby Club in Gosport affiliated to the RFU. The assessment has identified a number of key issues relating to the demand for and supply of rugby union pitches. These are:
 - Current demand is adequately serviced by the current pitch supply if senior pitches are used to accommodate some junior games, and when factoring in the quality of provision. There is scope for some growth to be accommodated but this may be limited on the Gosport Park site. Bay House School is planning to resurface two of its Rugby Pitches so they are level.
 - There is a deficit of 2 junior pitches in 2021 this could be met by the use of Bay House Schools Rugby Pitches.
 - The quality of pitches is good and the changing room facilities at Gosport Park are perceived as good.
 - The club has reported increasing usage which is having a detrimental effect on sustained quality at the existing ground. This may mean looking at alternative facilities such as Bay House School for additional use.

RECOMMENDATIONS

R1. There is a future requirement in 2021 for 2 additional junior rugby pitches. Developer contributions could help Gosport and Fareham Rugby Club improve the quality of its pitches by providing drainage and leveling or discussions could be held with Bay House School on the development of its two rugby pitches for future use to meet demands of Gosport and Fareham Rugby Club.



- 3.135 The England Hockey Board (EH) is the National Governing Body for all hockey in England. Their 'Whole Sport Plan 2013 -2017' aims to invest £2 million of its Sport England grant in hockey facilities, mainly for the refurbishment of artificial grass pitches, the remaining £10 million will support the grassroots game and the development of gifted players with Olympic ambitions.
- 3.136 The game is currently played predominately on sand based artificial grass pitches. There is one club, Gosport Borough Hockey Club. The club has 3 ladies, 3 men's, junior boys under 16's team and a junior section under 14's under 10's and mini micro under 8's.
- 3.137 The club links with schools in particular St Vincent's College where it uses the sand based pitch for training and competitive matches. It has recently teamed up with Gosport Cricket Club to use the cricket clubhouse as its home social base.
- 3.138 The Table 3.13 below identifies the number of hockey teams by age groups.

NUMBER OF PITCHES

3.141 Table 3.15 shows that there is only one sand dressed AGP available for community use in 2013.

- 3.142 The site assessment states that the quality of the pitch has deteriorated with the surface needing attention and possible replacement. England Hockey is concerned and has recently requested an independent survey of the pitch. There is an additional facility at Bay House School which up until recently has been for the schools private use. However, Gosport Hockey Club have had recent use of the Bay House facility and will continue to do so on occasions in the future.
- 3.143 The St Vincent's College pitch was built in 2003. The average life of a carpet is 10 12 years.

CURRENT SUPPLY AND DEMAND

- 3.144 Temporal Demand for Games. The assessment reveals that all junior games are played on a Sunday and Senior games on a Saturday.
- 3.145 Current Supply and Demand Assessment: Hockey The quantitative assessment has revealed that there is a good supply of pitches to cater for three games on a Saturday which is required with the 6 senior teams and there is room for an additional two games on a Sunday which indicates the club has room to develop a further 4 teams before requiring an additional pitch.

HOCKEY CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.146 The key issues relating to supply and demand of hockey can be summarised as:
 - Current demand is met by the available AGP pitch supply at St Vincent's College although demand is split between seniors and juniors for games on a Saturday and Sunday.
 - There is no current identified demand but as the club grows with its junior development there will be a need for a second Sand Based pitch in the future to provide for hockey this is expected to be beyond 2021.

- In the mean time the carpet on the existing AGP will has become worn and will require replacing. Off site developer contributions would assist in replacing this carpet in the future.
- Gosport Hockey Club now shares a Clubhouse with Gosport Cricket Club.

RECOMMENDATIONS - HOCKEY

- H1. There will be a future requirement for an additional Sand Based AGP for hockey as the Hockey Club develops this is envisaged to be beyond 2021.
- H2. Off site developer contributions would assist in replacing the current St Vincent's AGP carpet in the future.



- 3.147 Artificial pitches are increasingly used in competitive sport. In the FA Guide to Artificial Pitches the FA has produced guidance on the development and maintenance of AGPs. In the Guide to Artificial Grass Pitches for Community Use: Part 1 Performance Standards for Surfaces and Pitches used Outdoors, the FA has produced additional guidance on the community use of artificial pitches. There are a number of performance tests based on the behavior of a ball used on the surfaces. These standards should be used by developers when installing new artificial pitches.
- 3.148 There is only one community use full sized AGP in Gosport at St Vincent's College available for community use. There is currently no third generation (3G) football AGP in Gosport. In order to assess if there is adequate AGP training provision the FA suggests that the number of teams located in an area should be divided by 56. Gosport currently has 119 football teams this equals 2 x 3G Artificial Pitches.
- 3.149 The demand for AGPs is rapidly growing and the National Governing Bodies are responding to this increasing demand with new guidance and rules on their use in competitions. Sport England has provided a guidance document: *Selecting the Right Artificial Surface.*
- 3.150 Sport England Active Places Power identifies 5 Artificial Grass Pitches in Gosport only ST Vincent's has community use. These are:
 - Bay House School Sand Filled AGP no community use
 - Fort Blockhouse Rubber Crumb MOD and Sports Club Use
 - HMS Sultan (Site 1) Sand filled
 - HMS Sultan (Site 1) Sand filled
 - St Vincent Leisure Sand filled

- 3.151 In addition at Gosport Leisure Centre there are 8 x 5 a side pitches and one 7 v 7 a side pitch.
- 3.152 In reality the only artificial grass pitches available for community use are St Vincent's College and the 8 x 5 a side and 7 v 7 a side pitch at Gosport Leisure Centre. Gosport Hockey Club have been able to hire out the Bay House Pitch on occasions (sand filled AGP <u>occasional</u> community use).
- 3.153 Bridgemary School has recently received planning permission for a full size 3rd generation pitch which is supported by The Football Association and Sport England.
- 3.154 The Sports Facilities Calculator Tool (SFC) can be used to assess the current supply of Artificial Grass Pitch provision. The SFC considers the age profile and size of a local population and provides an estimate of the level of provision which should be available to meet the needs of that population. The SFC does not take into account, actual usage levels of facilities, the quality, accessibility or other demand which may be imported or exported to neighbouring local authorities. Table 3.16 provides information on the Sports Facility Calculator for Gosport for Artificial Grass Pitches.

3.155 The SFC identifies that there is a current need for 2.65 pitches in 2013 and 2.65 pitches in 2021.

RECOMMENDATIONS - ARTIFICIAL GRASS PITCH

- AGP1. The demand modeling identifies a need for 2.65 pitches in 2013 and 2.65 pitches in 2021.
- AGP2. There is currently a sand dressed artificial grass pitch at St Vincent's College which is used for hockey and football. Bridgemary School will be providing a 3rd generation artificial pitch in Gosport.
- AGP3. Where possible the Council should support the replacement / refurbishment of the St Vincent's College carpet on the sand dressed ATP.
- AGP4. Additional AGP sand based would help meet future demands on hockey which will be required beyond 2021.

⁴ HCC Long Term Population Projection for 2021 is based on the proposed number of dwellings in the emerging Gosport Borough Local Plan from a base population figure of 82,605 in 2011. The 2013 figure is the latest ONS estimate for the Borough.

PROVISION IN NEIGHBOURING AUTHORITIES

3.156 Given the geographical location of Gosport Borough, it is likely that only Fareham facilities will impact on supply and demand. A similar pitch assessment has been undertaken with the following observations made. A general consensus that there is little "import or export" of demand, with most teams playing within the Borough or district from which they originate. The two assessments have though identified some teams that access facilities outside of their home Borough and these mainly now play in the Gosport, Fareham and Solent League. On the basis of the research undertaken, there does not appear to be any major issues for Gosport BC as result of pitch quantity and quality in neighbouring authorities.

NON – PITCH SPORTS: ASSESSMENT METHODOLOGY

- 3.157 The assessment of demand for and supply of, Outdoor Bowling Greens, Netball and Tennis Courts falls outside the scope of the assessment methodology detailed in 'Towards a Level Playing Field' (Sport England 2003). A number of factors make these sports difficult to assess, from both a demand and supply perspective. These include:
 - **Demand** for these sports manifests itself in a variety of ways. Participation for example, can be on an individual, casual basis or as part of a team playing in a formal competitive match.
 - <u>Access</u> to facilities, which can be complex in some cases. For example, membership policies of clubs can vary from full open access, through to nomination based policy. Casual use of facilities can vary from the need to purchase a season ticket through to traditional pay and play access of facilities.
 - **<u>Supply</u>** of facilities can also vary greatly. The actual size of a bowling green for example, whether it has floodlighting, and the presence of ancillary facilities can greatly affect the capacity of facilities to meet demand.
- 3.158 The assessment of Bowling Greens, Netball and Tennis Courts has been undertaken on the basis of:
 - An audit of known facilities within Gosport.
 - Consultation with existing Bowls, and Tennis Clubs to determine current membership profiles and the likelihood of growth or decline in the future. Clubs were also asked to rate the quality of facilities used and to identify key facility related issues.
- 3.159 In undertaking the assessment of non-pitch sports a number of key factors have been considered, including:
 - What are the <u>opportunities</u> for potential new participants to take part in the sport?
 - Are there particular <u>access</u> issues for potential new participants, including cost of participation and geographical location of facilities?
 - Are the needs of current participants met by current facilities?



3.160 Bowling Greens as sports facilities accommodate a range of formal and casual use. Demand manifests itself through differing uses, such as formal bowling teams using facilities for league games, or for individuals to bowl on a more casual or informal basis. Bowling greens throughout Gosport are mainly provided as public facilities (often in parks) and private facilities (through private bowling clubs) all identified bowling greens are represented in Table 3.17

QUANTITY: BOWLING GREENS

- 3.161 It is important to note that no recognised standard of provision exists for bowling greens at a national level. It is also important to recognise that bowling is a demand led sport.
- 3.162 There are 7 known clubs across Gosport and these clubs and their venues are identified in Table 3.17 below. There are three sites all leased to clubs these are Forton, Rowner and Lee-on-the-Solent.
- 3.163 The pavilion at Cunningham Drive, used by the Bridgemary Bowls Club is leased but the green isn't. The Council is responsible for the maintenance at Anglesey Road and Gosport Park.



- 3.164 All the bowls clubs were sent a questionnaire of which 4 responded.
- 3.165 The main problems perceived by the clubs include: maintenance of anti fox fencing, squirrels issue on roofing of pavilions, teenage vandalism and insufficient car parking at some clubs.
- 3.166 One club believes its membership will grow in the future and three clubs believe membership will remain the same and 3 clubs did not reply.
- 3.167 The majority of clubs identified a difficulty in retaining and recruiting members.
- 3.168 There is one club with low membership Alverstoke Bowls Club at Gosport Park. The quality of the facilities is good. Signs of wear on the green surface were identified at Rowner Lane, Forton and Bridgemary.

RECOMMENDATIONS - BOWLS

- 3.169 The recommendations are:
 - **B1.** Gosport Borough Council to work with the local Bowls Clubs to promote the sport in Gosport, and encourage participation by younger people
 - **B2.** Improve the publishing of information to promote the health benefits and opportunities to play bowls
 - **B3.** If and when bowls club memberships fall to below 20 consideration should be given to the amalgamation of those clubs



- 3.170 Tennis courts are provided in a variety of settings, including schools, parks and both public and private sports grounds. They are provided for casual opportunities and formal competitive play. As with bowls, the demand for tennis is varied, ranging from facilities to accommodate formal league matches to casual games between friends and family.
- 3.171 The audit has identified a total of 2 Gosport Council sites: Privett Park (5 courts) and Lee on the-Solent (2 courts).
- 3.172 Both of these sites are free to play tennis on and are part of the Lawn Tennis Association All Play Initiative. The Council tennis courts were resurfaced in 2012.
- 3.173 Stokes Bay also provides tennis courts (4 courts) for which there are a fee.
- 3.174 Brune Park Community College has 4 tennis Courts that they hire out when the Gosport and Fareham Netball League are not using them for Netball.
- 3.175 In addition to the above courts there are excellent tennis facilities provided at two clubs in Gosport. The two clubs are Alverstoke Tennis and Squash Club and Lee –on –the- Solent Tennis Squash and Badminton Club. Both of these clubs have excellent tennis facilities.
- 3.176 Alverstoke Tennis and Squash Club has 7 artificial grass courts refurbished in February 2013 one of these is floodlit; there are also 2 hard all weather courts with practice hitting walls and 1 indoor court. Members play social tennis and teams represent the club in local leagues. There is a strong junior section. Members Club Night is held every Thursday 6pm till dusk and all abilities are welcome.
- 3.177 The clubs coaches run a full training programme for senior and junior members with extra sessions in school holidays. Non members can join classes as well.

- 3.178 Lee on the Solent Tennis, Squash and Badminton Club has six outdoor all weather courts 3 of these are floodlit and two of these have recently been refurbished to provide two tiger turf advantage courts.
- 3.179 Both Alverstoke and Lee on the Solent Tennis clubs work with the Lawn tennis Association to promote tennis and provide for the following activities:
 - Junior Tennis players of a similar age and standard to learn new skills and tactics which you can put in play in your competitions.
 - Tennis Xpress / Adult beginners Tennis is a game for life. It requires agility, speed and endurance, so it's a brilliant way to keep fit while developing motor and coordination skills.
 - AEGON Team Tennis Represent the club in a fun and social team environment in local leagues and other team competitions such as AEGON Team Tennis.
 - Cardio Tennis
 - Free Tennis Sometimes The courts are available FREE of charge sometimes contact the club for details of times.
 - Not just membership but also offer Pay and Play Opportunities for players to come and participate on a pay and play basis; court bookings and coaching.

RECOMMENDATIONS - TENNIS

- 3.180 The recommendations for tennis courts are:
 - T1. Retain the current provision of tennis courts and work with key partners, the Lawn Tennis Association and Gosport clubs to maintain quality and improve access for potential new participants
 - T2. Ensure Gosport Council owned public courts have appropriate fencing, quality nets and posts all weather nets where appropriate, markings are clear and surfaces are clean and free of debris.
 - T3. Gosport Council to encourage tennis clubs in the development of club facilities and courts to increase participation and quality of facilities.



- 3.181 The Gosport and Fareham Netball Association (GFNA) is an established women's league that has been running for over 50 years. The 2012 league was made up of 7 divisions hosting 56 teams and the junior league is split into 23 teams split into age group divisions U12s, U14s and U16s.
- 3.182 The GFNA autumn season runs from September January and the Spring Season February/March July. Matches are played on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays at Brune Park Community College netball and tennis courts.
- 3.183 The courts at Brune Park need to be relayed and the Development Officer for Netball is looking at funding to move the league elsewhere.
- 3.184 The league would like its own purpose built facilities with six outdoor courts a clubroom and coaching facilities.

RECOMMENDATIONS - NETBALL

N1 Gosport Council to encourage the GNFA in the development of club facilities and courts to increase participation and quality of facilities
