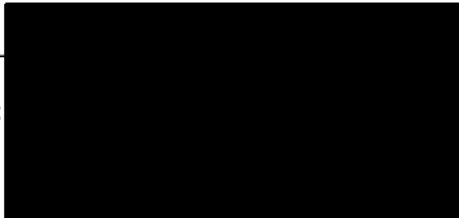

It is very positive to see that water resources have been given an individual policy; we are very supportive of this approach.

We welcome the acknowledgment of the importance of water and strongly support the reference to the Water Framework Directive (WFD) in Section 1 and are pleased to see reference to both the protection and enhancement of WFD waterbodies within the area.

We are very encouraged to see the requirement for new developments to include measures to reduce water consumption to 110 litres per person as outlined in Section 2 of the policy.

We welcome the proposal in Section 3 to phase development to coincide with the adequate provision of necessary wastewater infrastructure and we also welcome the requirement to separate surface water from existing foul or combined sewers in Section 3. b).

We are very pleased to see reference to the Water Framework Directive (WFD) in Section 12.19 and the associated Box 12.3: Water Framework Directive and the intention to liaise with the EA on relevant planning applications as set out in Section 12.20.

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We are very encouraged to see the requirement for new developments to include measures to reduce water consumption to 110 litres per person as outlined in Section 2 of the policy.

We welcome the proposal in Section 3 to phase development to coincide with the adequate provision of necessary wastewater infrastructure and we also welcome the requirement to separate surface water from existing foul or combined sewers in Section 3. b).

We are very pleased to see reference to the Water Framework Directive (WFD) in Section 12.19 and the associated Box 12.3: Water Framework Directive and the intention to liaise with the EA on relevant planning applications as set out in Section 12.20.

We support the intention to seek opportunities to improve both the River Alver and the Hoeford Stream, both of which are currently failing under the WFD and we are pleased to see the recognition that water efficiency has multiple benefits and can help contribute to the integrity of habitats of international importance.

We strongly agree with the wording within Section 12.26 with regards to the consideration of capacity of Peel Common Wastewater Treatment Works when reviewing new developments.

With regards to Section 12.31 we would like to highlight that the relevant section of the Flood and Water Management (2010) which relates to SuDs Approval Bodies (SABs) has not yet been enacted. We suggest that the wording is changed to provide more flexibility to allow for the plan to be consistent with the outcome of the implementation of Schedule 3 of the Act.
