In the Gosport Borough Council's 2011-2029 proposed Local Plan, the Council propose to designated the Northern Site of Priddy's Hard Nature Conservation Area (SU612301224) as "Open Space" and a "SINC" - This designation "Open Space" is not legally compliant

Reasons for objection

The site is dominated by two large former Munitions Stores It's a Brownfield site in Gosport's urban area. To change this site to "Open Space" seriously interferes with the interests of those former Cordite Magazines so as to preserve an important part of the heritage of Gosport.

These substantial historic buildings have been omitted from consideration in the Local Plan. The buildings have been left in a state of disrepair since the MOD decommissioned them in the early 1990's. The buildings are subject to vandalism and potential misuse. With no mention in the Local Plan as to the outcome of these historic buildings but to zone the land Open Space is not legally compliant.

There has been no consultation with the owners as to how the changes will be funded or to endeavour to reach an agreement.

Please set out what change(s) you consider necessary to make the Local Plan legally compliant or sound, with reference to the answer you have identified in Q3.

You will need to say why this change will make the Local Plan sound.

The Local Plan should state or allocate how these former Munitions Stores can be used and preserved while still balancing the needs to protect the habitats of the badgers and crested newts. The use allocation of the former munitions stores should be realistic and viable so that funds are available for the ongoing maintenance of the wildlife habitats. As the owners of this site we want the designation of "Open Space" removed from the Local Plan.

Does land need to be in public ownership?

A Local Green Space does not need to be in public ownership. However, the local planning authority (in the case of local plan making) or the qualifying body (in the case of neighbourhood plan making) should contact landowners at an early stage about proposals to designate any part of their land as Local Green Space. Landowners will have opportunities to make representations in respect of proposals in a draft plan.

Management of land designated as Local Green Space will remain the responsibility of its owner. If the features that make a green area special and locally significant are to be conserved, how it will be managed in the future is likely to be an important consideration.
