The Town Hall will reopen at 9am on Tuesday 4th January 2022.





Community Lifelines

Our Community Alarm Service is available to vulnerable people in the community and provides peace of mind for our customers and those that care for them. The service is a landline telephone-based alarm system that is provided 24 hours day, every day of the year, providing help, support and security.

The alarm system is made up of an alarm base unit and a pendant, which can be worn around the neck or on the wrist.

How Does it Work?

- We connect the alarm base unit to your telephone line
- If the pendant is pressed there is instant two-way speech contact with our specialist call centre, PPP Taking Care.
- Our call centre will contact the emergency services, next of kin or our staff if required.

How Much Does it Cost?

The cost includes 24-hour alarm monitoring, rental, maintenance and VAT.*

Payments are made over a 48 week period, but the service is provided to you 52 weeks of the year. The cost is £4.09 inc. VAT* per week (£3.41 with VAT exemption)

* You are exempt from VAT if you declare that you are chronically sick or disabled (for example, if you suffer from an ongoing illness such as heart problems or arthritis).

Every consideration is given to people who are having genuine difficulties, but collecting rent must be the priority for the Council to provide the services that you need.

How to save money during Christmas

After spending last Christmas in lockdown there may be a temptation to treat loved ones even more than usual this year. You don't want to start 2022 in the red, so with a bit of planning, budgeting and tracking your spending you will still be able to have a fantastic Christmas without going into 2022 with a financial hangover.

If you are on a tight budget but are determined to make the most of the holiday season without breaking the bank, see below some helpful tips:

Plan before you spend!



Don't be tempted to put all your Christmas purchases on to a credit card, make a list of everyone that you plan to buy for and how much you can afford to spend on each person, after bills and essentials are covered.

Stick to your budget

Once you have set a budget, keep track on your spending so that you will be less likely to overspend.

Whether you use a notebook, an app on your phone or create an excel spreadsheet; choose a system that works for you.

Don't lose your head over sales!



In all the other special offers in the run-up to Christmas, remember that a bargain is only a bargain if you were planning on buying it in the first place!

Expenses to consider when creating your Christmas budget

First things first, when creating your Christmas budget, make sure that you consider all expenses, not just the gifts.

Things such as wrapping paper, Christmas cards and bows can add up quickly. You also want to consider your travel expenses such as fuel and accommodation.


If you are considering having a Christmas Lunch at home, you will need to factor in the expense for all the food that you need to purchase.

Plan every meal



Don't be duped into buying more food than you need. If a 'buy one, get one half price' offer is genuinely good value for you, then go for it, but if you don't actually need two of the item, avoid!

At Christmas, everyone tends to over-cater on the food front. Also by swapping branded products for own-brand can make a significant difference to your weekly food bill, too.



If making ends over the Christmas period look like they will be a struggle, be honest and speak to your family and friends; they would much rather you didn't give a gift than end up owing money in the new year. Instead you could plan to do something special in the Spring.

Christmas on a budget: Alternatives to buying presents

There is nothing more precious than the gift of time or lending a helping hand. Rather than buying a gift, you can help a friend or a loved one in other ways. If you have an elderly or disabled loved one that can't get around very well, you could help them by carrying out household chores, gardening or running errands.

A picture is worth a thousand words, you can pick up photo frames and albums cheaply. You could create a personalised photo album or scrapbook for your loved ones.

Another alternative to buying gifts on a Christmas budget is to shop second hand. You can find brilliant deals on jewellery, musical instruments, electronic items and more at pawn shops, second-hand shops, and online.

Do 'family gifts' or a Secret Santa

If you find that you have got lots of people that you want to buy for, such as extended family and friend groups – this idea is a great way to keep costs down. A box of chocolates, tinned biscuits or a board game can be a super family gift.

Watch your bank account and credit card

If your bank offers the facility to notify you when your account dips below a set amount, set it up! It will help you keep track and prevent you going overdrawn.

Avoid 'buy now, pay later'

These are tempting schemes that retailers offer but try to avoid them, unless you have a plan for repaying the load within the interest free period. Otherwise you may find that when the interest rate is charged at the end of the interest free may end up costing you more than the original item!

With all these tips you should be able to put together a solid plan to avoid any holiday debt and come out the other side of Christmas with your financial goals intact.

SWITCHED ON

10 TIPS TO STAY WARM AND SAVE MONEY THIS WINTER

- 1. Check if you are eligible for a free home energy visit! You could get:
 - Free LED lightbulbs
 - Radiator reflectors
 - Referrals to an income maximisation service to boost your income
 - Referrals to grant-funded larger measures like insulation and more during a free energy visit
- 2. Check if you are eligible for Warm Home Discount Scheme (£140 off your Winter electricity (or potentially gas) bill.
- 3. Insulate, insulate, insulate! Cavity Wall insulation is estimated to save you £95 per year on your energy bill for a mid-terraced house. There is Government funding for insulation, and you don't necessarily need to be on a benefit to be eligible.
- 4. Check if you could sign up to your energy company's priority services register; this can give you advanced notice of planned power cuts, support taking meter reading if you are unable to and much more.

- 5. Check if you could save more on your water bills with Southern Water.
- Check if you can increase your income.
 Our free home energy visit provides referrals in an income maximisation service.
- Set efficient heating settings consider setting your thermostat and programmers for a comfortable but cost-effective programme. Between 18 and 21 degrees is recommended to be an efficient but comfortable range.
- Get a smart meter for a more accurate and real-time dashboard of your energy spends. This can send real-time readings to your supplier, meaning accurate billing.
- 9. Submit regular meter readings to your energy supplier so that they can bill you accurately.

How to pay your housing charges

Your rent is due in advance, either weekly or monthly. Your rent, charges or arrears can be paid in the following ways:

Direct Debit

Pay monthly via your own bank or building society on 1st, 8th, 15th or 22nd of each month. This can be set up over the telephone by contacting **023 9254 5665**, when setting up please ensure that the bank account holder is present. Direct Debit mandates are available on request.

By telephone

Call **023 9254 5665** to pay using your debit or credit card, between 9am and 5pm. If you want to make multiple payments for rent, council tax and any other payments please call **023 9258 4242**.

Standing Order

Construction starts at new multi-million-pound affordable Extra Care housing scheme with care for older people in Gosport

Hampshire's latest Extra Care scheme is off the ground as construction starts on the brand new affordable rented housing development at Willis Road in Gosport

The project is being delivered by Hampshire County Council, Gosport Borough Council, Lovell Later Living (LLL) – part of the Morgan Sindall Group – and Places for People Living Plus who will own and complete the development.

To celebrate the start onsite, the partners gathered this week to hear from Lovell Later Living, setting out how plans will see the 60 one and two-bedroom apartment development for the over 55s with 24/7 care and support, complete by Summer 2023.

Hampshire County Council's Executive Lead Member for Adult Services and Public Health, Councillor Liz Fairhurst, said:

"This brand new scheme will make a huge difference to the lives of older residents in and around the Gosport area. We have seen the benefits that Extra Care can bring by enabling people to live independently in a home of their own, but with support available whenever they need it.

"The Gosport scheme forms an important part of the County Council's £45 million investment in Extra Care across Hampshire, designed to help ensure the accommodation needs and aspirations of our growing older population can be met."

Cllr Tony Jessop, chair of Gosport Borough Council's Housing Board, said:

"It's great to see this project reach another major milestone. We look forward to helping potential residents find homes in this exciting new development." The scheme, designed in partnership with Re-Format Architecture and Design, will transform the Willis Road site into modern, purpose built accommodation for older people, providing affordable, independent living in self contained apartments with access to 24/7 care on site, plus a range of communal facilities, such as a restaurant and lounge.

Andy Lomas, Managing Director of Places for People Living Plus, said:

"We are delighted to be working together with our partners to offer affordable, new Extra Care homes to people in Gosport.

"We are passionate about creating welldesigned, affordable homes, and have great experience delivering services of this kind across the country – most recently successfully completing similar homes in nearby Romsey. Extra Care apartments such as those, and this new offering on Willis Road, are ideal for customers who wish to remain independent, with their own front door and privacy, yet with the knowledge that they can be supported in their own home when necessary. We look forward to working with future residents in Gosport as we move forward with the build."

Apartments at the scheme will be available as affordable housing with care through Places for People Living Plus. 
