### Would you like to supply your goods or services to the council and others in the south east?


The council is keen to see more local businesses registered on the South East Business Portal (SEBP), that it and the other 73 local authorities in the region use to promote their contract opportunities.

## Management course for SME leaders to deliver from Gosport

The University of Portsmouth will soon start delivering its 'Help to Grow: Management Course' to small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) in Gosport for the first time.

The fully-funded course is aimed at senior leaders and covers strategies for growth and innovation, how to lead high-performing teams, digital adoption, financial management and responsible business practices.

The 12-week 'Help to Grow: Management Course' is 90% government funded and currently Portsmouth Business School is funding the remaining 10%, making it fully-funded for local SMEs.

Beginning this September, the programme is delivered by entrepreneurs and industry experts and accredited by the Small Business Charter. It will be delivered from the Imagination Refinery in the town centre and includes online and face-to-face sessions, 1-to-1 mentoring and peer networking, and is designed to fit around existing work and commitments.
