My family and I regularly attend the tea time concerts at Holy Trinity Church. These concerts are very popular and on occasion not only is the car park opposite full but there are no vacant parking places in the streets surrounding the church either. Therefore I must object to any plan that seeks to build on the existing car park or in the Trinity Green area.

Gosport's bus station is huge and I wondered whether some buses could share bays thus reducing its size. There could also be a restaurant overlooking the harbour and sited over the bus station.

Walpole Park, the green where the fairs visit regularly and charities have their events. Well, it would be a shame to concrete it over and to make it just another car park. It would be so visible. So I object to that. Perhaps the existing car park (where the swimming pool used to be and is opposite the town hall) could be made bigger and in that way it would not be so noticeable.

I live opposite the SSSI site Workhouse Lake which is thronged by a large parked camper and removal van. I cannot understand why these vehicles are allowed to park outside people's homes or block RAMSAR sites. Gosport Borough Council do not allow these vehicles in their normal car parks so why should they be allowed to litter SSSI sites. I have spoken to Cllr June Cully about this who said she would look into it.
